Rules of the game

This **Electro**® game is for young children who have not yet learnt to read. The questions and answers are all depicted by drawings. Of course, the children will need a little help, especially at the beginning.

How does Electron work?

The sheets are divided into a left side for the questions and a right side for the answers. You ask a question by putting one of the pins into the hole of a drawing on the left side. Then you must look for the answer on the right side. You must put the other pin into the hole of your answer. If the answer is correct, the bulb will light up.

Before you begin:

There is only one type of task on each sheet. The questions on the sheets need not be answered in any particular order. The difficulty of the tasks on sheets 1 to 5 may vary with individual children. Start with the sheet that is most suitable for your child. A brief explanation of each sheet is given to set you on your way.

1 Puzzle

On the right, you'll find pieces from the puzzle on the left. We have enlarged the pictures on some of the pieces.

1* Details

This exercise is similar to card 1, but more difficult, because the drawings are only in 2 colours and the details have been enlarged or drawn from another angle. See if you can find the details shown on the right in the pictures on the left.

2 Find Winnie the Pooh's toy

You can see Winnie the Pooh playing in each of the spaces on the left. Find his toy on the right-hand side.

2* Find the pairs

Try and find the matching pictures of Tigger and Piglet. Even though they may differ in size, their pose must be same.

3 Find the matching pictures

On the left, there are 3 drawings of each of Winnie the Pooh's 8 friends. You may have to look carefully to tell them apart. Try and find the exact match on the right. The background colour should provide the clue.

3* Silhouettes

See if you can recognise Winnie the Pooh or one of his friends in the silhoue to on the right.

4 Counting

Count the objects, and see if you can find the right number. But don't count Winnie the Pooh!

4* The Alphabet

Winnie the Pooh says: 'Come dance with me, while you say your ABC!' Each time you come to a gap on the left, fill in the missing letter from those on the right.

5 Find the similarities

There are two identical pictures of each situation, one on the left and one on the right. You can see a birthday party, someone dancing or a rain shower. If this exercise is too hard, you can always look at the background colour to help find the right answer.

5* Making streamers

It's party time, but the decorations aren't finished yet! Find the last piece of each streamer on the right.
