



## ENGLISH

Age: 6 years and up  
Players: 2 – 5

### PRESENTATION

Are you ready to be the quickest to find the pieces of your puzzles? Find them all, put them together before anyone else does, and you will win the game.

### CONTENTS

24 puzzles with 6 pieces each  
24 picture cards

### AIM OF THE GAME

Be the first player to find all 6 pieces of your puzzle and put them together to complete the picture on your card.

### PREPARATION

Place all the puzzle pieces face up in the middle of the table within easy reach of all the players. Put the picture cards in a pile at the side, face-down.

### HOW THE GAME WORKS

Puzzle has three ways to test your speed and observation skills in a fun way.

#### 1. FAST PUZZLE

The youngest player is appointed the game master and deals a face down picture card to each player starting with themselves. Then they say "3, 2, 1... GO!" to start the round. All the players turn their cards over and, all at the same time, search the middle of the table to find the puzzle pieces they need to make their picture.

When a player finds one of the pieces they need, they take it and put it next to their picture card. As soon as they find their sixth piece, they put their puzzle together and shout "Puzzle!" They win their card and are appointed game master for the next round.

The other players discard their picture cards along with the pieces they have managed to find and everyone gets a new card to play. The pieces you have not found from your previous card are left in the centre of the table.

The game continues in this way until one of the players completes 5 puzzles and wins the game.

#### 2. PUZZLE RACE

The game is played in the same way as in the "Quick Puzzle" mode, but each player receives 3 picture cards at the start of the game, which they place face down in a pile in front of them without looking at them. The youngest player announces the start of the game by saying "3, 2, 1... GO!" and all the players turn over their first card and begin to look for the pieces they need.

When a player finishes their puzzle, they turn over their next card and continue playing. The first player to finish their three puzzles wins the game.

#### 3. PIECE BY PIECE

In this variation for experienced players, the 24 picture cards are placed face up in the centre of the table instead of the pieces, which are left in the game box. The youngest player takes a random piece out of the box and shows it to everyone. The first player to find the card that contains the picture shown on the piece wins the card and places it in front of them.

The player who wins the card then draws a new piece and the game continues in the same way. The cards that players have in front of them remain in play and can be won by another player if a new piece of that puzzle comes up.

The first player to have 5 picture cards in front of them wins the game.
